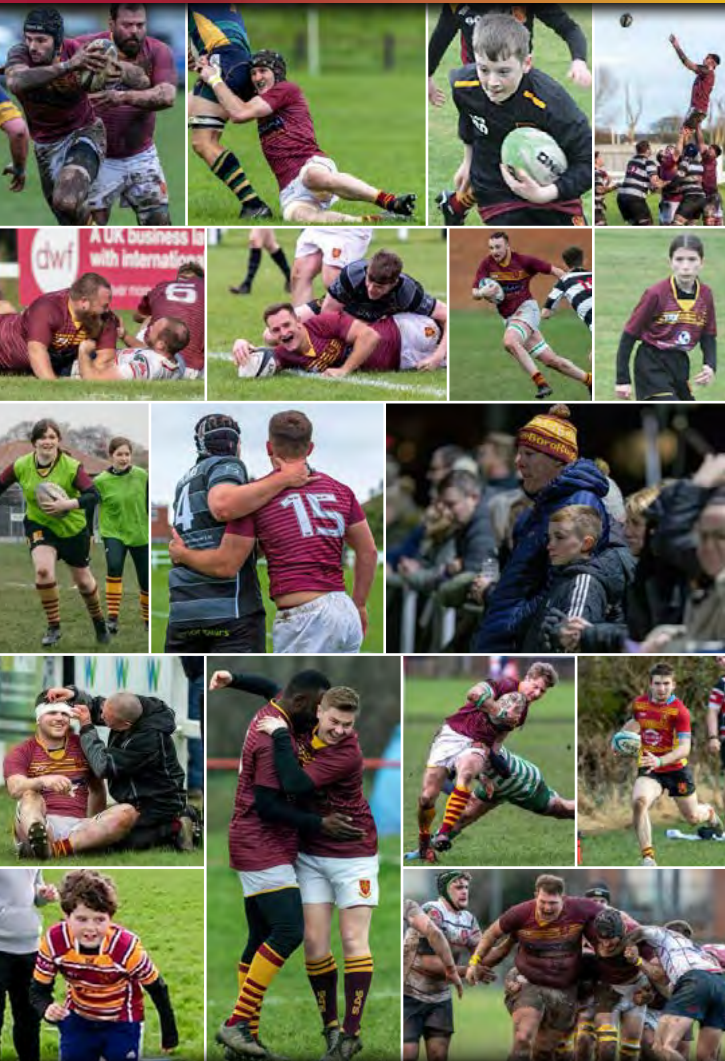

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A Welcome FROM COLTS COACH: ROB KENSEY

I would like to wish a warm welcome to Alnwick for their league visit to Acklam Park today. Looking at their league form it will be a stern challenge for Middlesbrough, but I'm sure the lads are up for the challenge.

As we approach the business end of the season, for the Boro Colts it looks to be an exciting end of season run in. The Colts currently sit third in their league behind West Park Leeds and Wharfedale, with four matches to go. A disappointing team performance last week vs Ripon saw the lads knocked off top spot. I'm sure they will bounce back and go again.

The Colts have also booked themselves a Yorkshire Cup Bowl semifinal after strong performances against Scarborough and Cleckheaton, and a narrow loss to Aireborough. Aireborough have gone on to the semifinal of the full Yorkshire Cup—so no disgrace there. Boro are currently waiting to learn their semifinal opponents.

It has definitely been a squad effort this season with 28 players being involved in league and cup matches, with a win rate of 75%. Myself and Garry Palmer, the other Colts coach, both believe regardless how the season finishes the Colts will continue to give their all every match, and they should all be proud of their achievements this season.

We have been working with Ollie and Rob (first team coaches) to get more of the Colts training with the seniors whenever possible, and to get them involved in Senior rugby on Saturday afternoons. Several have now played and we hope for more to follow. We are looking at how we make the transition from Colts to Senior rugby smoother so we retain more players going forward. All suggestions welcomed!

The Colts, Juniors, and Mini sections are all going well, with good numbers and some strong age grade teams coming through. The future looks bright for Boro, both for the Men's and Women's teams. This has a lot to do with the tremendous effort of all the coaches, from Tag to Colts - so well done, and thank you, to everyone involved.

Finally I would like to wish you all a great afternoon of rugby, enjoy the hospitality and a safe trip home.

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TODAY'S OPPONENTS: ALNWICK RUFC



Making their way down from Greensfield are our Northumberland opponents, Alnwick RFC. Originally formed back in 1880, Alnwick are nearly as old as us!

Alnwick are on great form this season. Their 13 wins in the league have them in second place, with a game in hand over nearest rivals Ilkley. One of those wins came at our expense back in November. Heartbreakingly, right at the death, the referee awarded a penalty to Alnwick. Their scrum half banged it over from about 35 yards, giving Alnwick a 31-23 win, wresting away our losing bonus point. Boro put in a tremendous shift that day and deserved to take much more out of the game – that performance should provide inspiration for today.

I did mention Alnwick are nearly as old as us but our files show our first recorded game as recent as September 1979. NASA sent a rocket to Saturn, British Leyland closed their MG plant in Abingdon, the Northern Division defeated the New Zealand All Blacks at Cross Green, Otley. And, Boro won its home friendly versus Alnwick 11-0 with two tries from A. Williams and a penalty from Ali Baxter. Until this year's recent league encounter the last meeting of the two was in April 2014. On that occasion, the Boro won away 22-19 with tries from Isa Warsama, Josh Evans and Richie Metcalfe, supplemented by some kicks from Simon O'Farrell.



We wish Alnwick all the very best with their hunt for promotion places. We hope they will understand that we have a fight of our own and will concede no quarter.

MIDDLESBROUGH 29 V SANDAL 26

SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 21, 2026. ACKLAM PARK

We welcomed Sandal Rugby Club to Acklam Park for our rearranged fixture in Regional 1 North East. With our Captain and Vice-Captain away at Twickenham, it was always going to be a tough test in this relegation avoidance scrap.

After a brisk start from Sandal, Middlesbrough started to exercise control and took the upper hand for the first half. Great hands allowed Henry Nyinguro to charge up the wing and grubber kick ahead only, for Sandal to tidy up and clear. This was exemplary of the pressure Boro were exerting. A series of phases and scrums inside the Sandal 22 had Boro crash the ball up again and again culminating in hooker Joe Sawdon scoring from close range. Aedan Moloney added the extras. 7-0.

Continued drives from Sawdon and Joe McNeill set up a gap for Rob Carney to score Boro's second try. A good conversion from Aedan gave the home side a fully deserved 14-0 lead. Boro should have taken this lead to the changing room had it not been for a penalty try awarded to Sandal on the stroke of half time. Henry received a dubious yellow card for hauling down the maul on the Boro line. HT: 14-7.

Boro started the second half in fine spirit. Carney kicked well down the slope. Under pressure Sandal fumbled near their line and a fine pop to Joe McNeill saw the number 8 barrel over to score. Aedan's conversion attempt scraped the top of the post. 19-7.

Boro started to feel the intensity of the game in their legs and Sandal roared back - charging up the field to score under the posts. 19-14. Sensing their opportunity, Sandal upped their tempo and earned a scrum penalty. The opted for posts to narrow the margin but missed the relatively simple chance.

To rub salt in the wound, Aedan landed a similar effort immediately after to stretch the Boro lead to 22-14. But Boro's eight point cushion would not last long. Sandal surged down the park again. They swung the ball wide, beat a few tackles, and dived over in the corner. Fortunately the conversion was unsuccessful. 22-19.

The ding-dong, back-and-forth persisted. Full back Matthew Marsay kicked deep. The chase was strong, pinning Sandal on their line. Smuggling the ball back, the returning Chris Lord powered over to score an important bonus point try which Moloney converted. 29-19.

As comfortable as a 10 point lead with five mins to go might seem...Sandal, once again, launched an impressive attack. Strength and good recycling got them their own bonus point converted try. 29-26.

With just seconds left on the clock, the Boro lads dug in to hold out for the whistle. Full Time Boro 29 v Sandal 26 - Phew!!

Big Congratulations to Matthew Helm on earning his 250th first team game for Boro.

Player Profile **MIKE WRIGHT**

Full Name: MICHAEL WRIGHT

Honours: Yorkshire County: 12 caps. North East Counties Squad: 1975 v Australia

Other Clubs: Morley RUFC 1964-68.

Q Time at the club & how it all started.

I joined MRUFC in 1968 after obtaining a full-time teaching post at Sir William Turner's Grammar School in Redcar. I fully intended to join Middlesbrough as I had played against them a few times whilst at Morley. In fact, my last game for Morley was against Middlesbrough at Middlesbrough. At that time, I didn't know I would be teaching in Redcar the following September. I was often asked why Middlesbrough? My answer was that they were of a similar standard to Morley, so it seemed the logical thing I joined them. When I started teaching at SWT, it was a great surprise to me to find that a number of the teaching staff there all played rugby for Middlesbrough. There was Tony Allison (former 1st XV capt.), Chub Riches (fellow PE staff and 1st XV fullback), Robbie Allan (1st XV winger) and joining the staff like that coming September; Alan Old (needs no introduction).

It follows that joining Middlesbrough was a no-brainer.

Q Who is best player you have played against?

As I was fortunate to play some representative rugby with Yorkshire, I played against many internationals, so to name one individual would be difficult. Names that come to mind are players like Roger Uttley, Bill Beaumont, Steve Smith and Malcolm Young all for England. Then there was Mike Gibson, Willie John McBride (Ireland); Jim Renwick, Andy Irvine, Arthur Brown, Ian McGeechan (Scotland); and, of course, for Wales there would be the full contingent of Lions and Internationals' who played against us for the club's Centenary game against London Welsh (arguably the best club side in the British Isles at that time) Geoff Evans, Clive Rees, Mike Roberts, Tom Shanklin, Jeff Young and, the best of the lot, JPR WILLIAMS – my favourite individual for this accolade.

Q Who was the best player you played with?

Another difficult category to name just one player, as when playing for Yorkshire / NE Counties there were some outstanding players like Ian McGeechan, Peter Squires, John Spencer, Roger Uttley, Alan Old, and Malcolm Young to name just a few. Whilst playing for Middlesbrough I was fortunate to be able to boast that I partnered three England Internationals and British Lions fly halves, namely Phil Horrocks-Taylor, Alan Old and Rob Andrew. To play with one would be incredible but to play with three is unbelievable. If asked to be more precise I would say out of these three, I would opt for Alan Old but add to that you have to say Rory Underwood must be included as one of the best players of all time.

Q Most memorable Boro game?

For me there are two games that stand out as the most memorable for different reasons.

The first game would undoubtedly be the Centenary game against the then best club side in the world, London Welsh. My brother got married on the same day, but I decided to play against London Welsh instead. It turned out to be a nailbiter. We were leading with a few minutes to go but they were awarded a penalty and JPR Williams stepped up to take it, instead of John Taylor (their regular kicker). JPR kicked it from almost the halfway line. We lost by that three-point margin. Straight after the game I had to jump in my car and travel to Leeds to join in the wedding reception, much to my annoyance, but it pleased my parents. The other game, wasn't the Cup Final win against Roundhay (a dour non-spectacular affair), but the semi-final game prior to the final, against Headingley at home. We were playing against a team full of internationals in their back line up. Ian McGeechan, John Spencer, Lampchowski, etc. I played one of my best games ever, scoring a try down the blindside, then tackling their U23 international in the last seconds of the game. If he had scored, they would have won the game. I took him out hitting the corner flag as he tried to ground the ball (in those days if you hit the corner flag you were deemed out of play).

As an anecdote to this - the report in the Daily Telegraph the following day had the sub-heading, '*which scrumhalf plays for England?*'

Q What does Middlesbrough Rugby Club mean to you? _____

Easy: 'EVERYTHING'

It means Family – I met Glenis at the club, and next year we celebrate our 50th Anniversary. Glenis has involved herself in the club, not just supporting me as a player, but by involving herself in club's activities as well.

My son Peter followed in my footsteps by playing 1st XV rugby, captaining the 1st team, and playing for Yorkshire at all levels (schools, clubs and senior level). He loves asking the question, 'how many times have you played at Twickenham dad?' Me: Never. Peter: Twice. Once for Yorkshire Colts against Middlesex and once for the Senior Yorkshire Team against Devon - winning on both occasions.

It also means 'FRIENDS for LIFE'

Rugby epitomises this statement, for wherever I travel I always bump into people I know, often forgetting their name, much to the annoyance of Glenis!

Q What do you do with your time since you stepped away from playing?

Initially I involved myself in helping out with coaching. I took all the necessary courses but didn't want to be 'the Coach' because, as a PE teacher, I was involved in that line anyway. I became involved in the committee side of the club filling various posts for a time:

Roles at the club:-

1st XV Captain: 1977- 79

President: 1999 -2001

Hon. Life Member: 2012

Club Chairman: 2009-2011

Fixture Secretary: 1991-1995

Chairman Of Selectors: 2002-2004

Add to this I was a Yorkshire County selector for five seasons in the 1990's (just before the game went professional). I went to three finals of the County Championship at Twickenham losing to Cornwall and Lancashire but defeating Middlesex in the other game.

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INVEST IN JUNIOR RUGBY AT MIDDLESBROUGH RUGBY CLUB

This is an investment in the future of our club and the sport we love.

There is no shortage of articles about the issues community clubs at grass roots face. At a time when many clubs have been forced to reduce their assets, MRUFC has invested in ours, laying the groundwork for our current generation of mini and junior players the opportunity to flourish.

At the 2021 AGM our members passed a motion to buy Tollesby playing fields. This was completed in late 2023. This was only possible by taking out a loan with the RFU. As it is a **commercial loan**, it comes with interest, and – we have to pay it back! To help reduce the short-term financial burden on the club, we are looking to our community and membership for further help.

The club is issuing 50 bonds at £1,000 each, with a payback period of up to 15 years. This will allow the club to smooth our cashflow to reduce the punitive burden of interest debt, better served by providing a playing facility for our juniors. We anticipate the vast majority of the bonds will be repayable well within 10 years of initial investment.

An example of the sort of help we have been able to secure includes longtime supporters AV Dawson and the Port of Middlesbrough who are working with us to sponsor the Tollesby site. These fields are used primarily for our Juniors and Minis, so you can fully understand the importance of this asset and what it means for the future of the Club and community.

All Bond Holders will be commemorated on the Tollesby Bond Board at the Tollesby Facility. We will acknowledge each bond holder in the matchday programme for our home games and each will be provided with a MRUFC Tollesby Bond lapel pin to recognise their contribution.

The procedure is incredibly simple. We have the loan documentation ready. All you have to do is contact Club Treasurer, Joe Secret on Joe_secret@hotmail.com.

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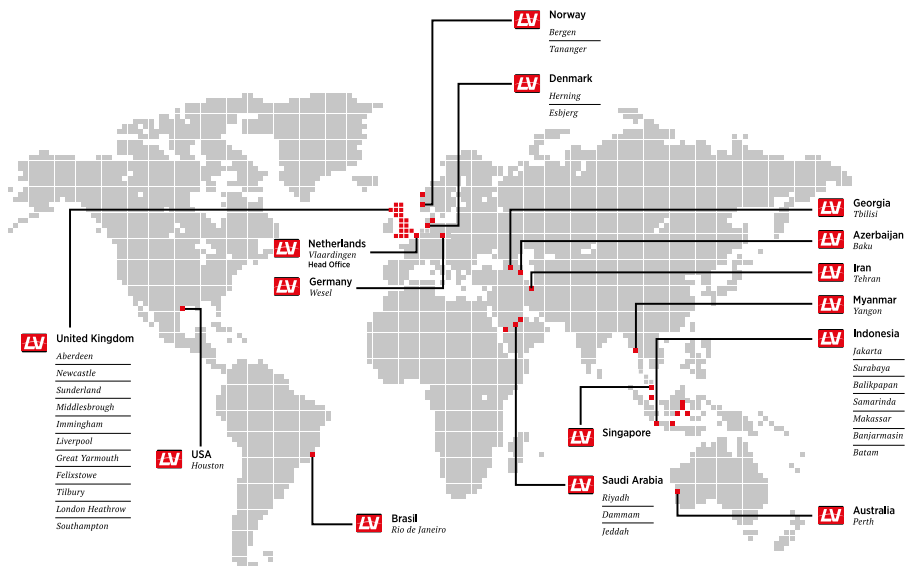

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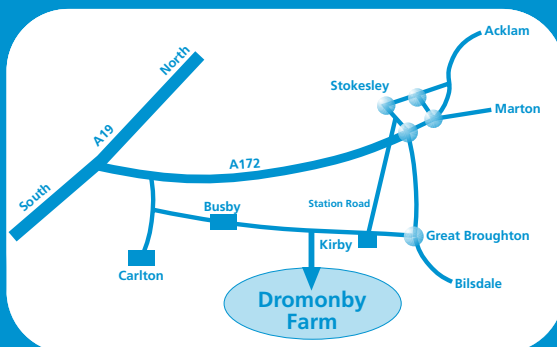
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
