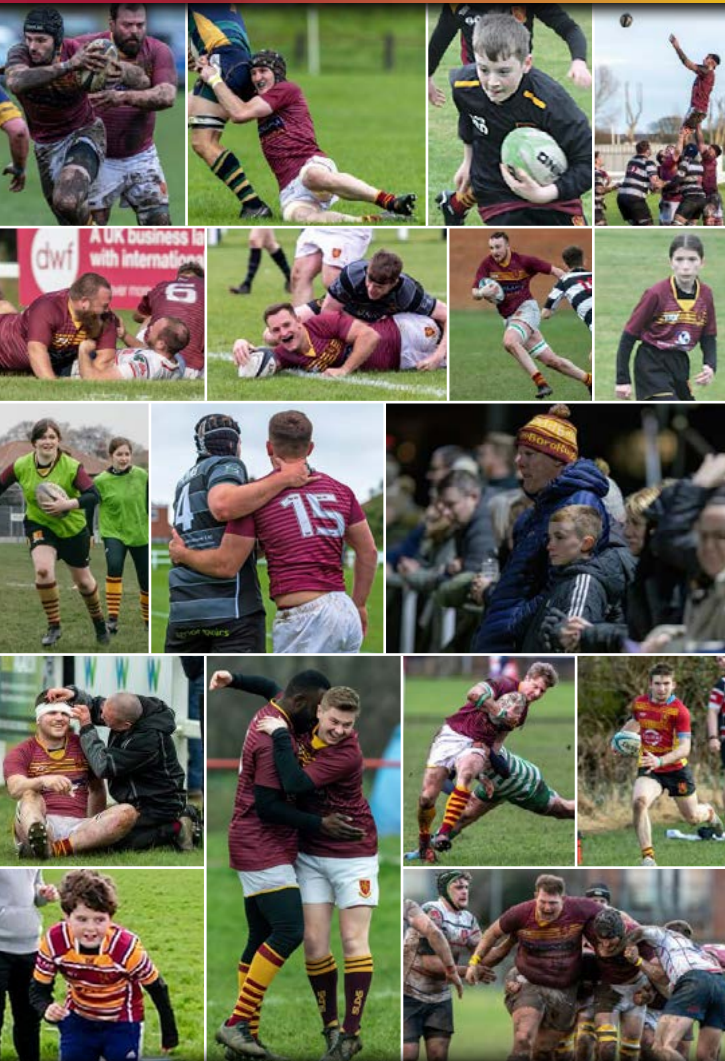

Good afternoon all,

MRUFC Women's Team. *"Who is that?"* I hear you say. This concept isn't new to the Club having had a Women's team so many years ago. And now, they are back for the 25/26 season and I am glad to be involved in the regeneration of the team.

With a mixture of new and experienced players we decided to enter the Inner Warrior league this year. Unfortunately there are not that many local teams at that

level, and we have therefore struggled to get regular fixtures, which is frustrating for the team. We expect this will improve next season when we look to move up to NC3.

The season has been successful, so far, with the team having played five and won five, with only one try scored against us in last four games. 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TODAY'S OPPONENTS: SANDAL RUFC



Today we welcome our friends and rivals from Milnthorpe Green, Sandbridge Lane. Sandal have travelled up from South Wakefield to try and build upon their victory earlier in the season.

Formed in 1937, Sandal will celebrate a century next year. Middlesbrough's first recorded game vs Sandal was back in 1989. We lost away 15-6 with a couple of pens from Ali Baxter. Our most notable recent win was, of course, in Doncaster for the 2023 Yorkshire Cup Final. We overcame our west Yorkshire combatants in the final minutes to crown a 30-24 victory with tries from Myles Colvin, Johs Lynas and Will Deeks, complemented by the boots of Andy Baggett and Brendan Hill.

Earlier this season Sandal produced an impressive display to put 59 points on us at their home ground. We did score 26 points of our own earning a losing BP with tries from Jack McPhillips, Ollie Hodgson, Harry Bryce and Ali Lang. Aedan Moloney added some conversions.



At kick-off today, Sandal find themselves eight points above Middlesbrough in the Regional 1 NE table in an enviable eighth place, just outside the relegation spots. Sandal had hit a good run of form, stringing together three wins on the trot against Ilkley, Kendal and York before succumbing to Alnwick.

It's a big game for both teams today. Let's all enjoy it.

FIRST TEAM MATCH REVIEWS

MIDDLESBROUGH 17 V YORK 33

SATURDAY, JANUARY 17, 2026. ACKLAM PARK.



With the Ilkley game postponed, this fixture marked the launch of the calendar year's fixtures for Middlesbrough.

Despite good tries from Myles Colvin, Matthew Marsay and Jack McPhillips, and a conversion from Aedan Moloney, Boro could never get a foothold in this game, characterised by knock-on's and penalties.

With the halftime score at 5-16 Boro seemed still in it but York stretched clear in the second half. Boro started well, moving the ball through the hands, over several phases - only for it to be intercepted and taken back under the posts for a converted try.

There was lots of endeavour from Boro – a great battling spirit and undoubted effort, but the spilling balls and no rub of the green, repeatedly dashed momentum.

With 10 minutes left Boro picked it up a notch. Full back Matthew Marsay scored out wide followed by a superb conversion from Aedan Moloney, but York came straight back and returned the favour with their own converted try out wide con.

Boro had the final say, with a try from skipper Jack McPhillips.

ILKLEY 73 V MIDDLESBROUGH 36

SATURDAY, JANUARY 24, 2026. DENTON ROAD, ILKLEY.

We won the second half...

On a dry but chilly Saturday, Middlesbrough travelled down to Ilkley to try and turn around the 10-60 drubbing we took in the reverse fixture in October.

Boro started well with some nice rumbling attacks, but a couple of spilled passes halted the momentum. A kick down the park from Ilkley caused confusion in the Boro defence and, as their winger was about to pounce on the ball to score, he was taken out illegally and a penalty try awarded. Brendan Hill was sent to the sin bin.

Middlesbrough responded in style through the middle with a series of popped passes and a break down the wing from Marsay. The attacking play was rewarded with try for Ollie Hodgson to tighten up the affair at 7-5.

Ilkley retaliated with a super break from their full back. He fed their wing who crossed for a try. They repeated this (a few times). The Ilkley backs were on fire and they showed some glorious handling, angles and support running. This lethal combination took Ilkley to 40 points versus our five.

A great Boro rally ended with Hodgson departing the pitch following a high tackle. Ollie was replaced by Henry Nyinguro. although Boro gained momentum and launched a series of promising attacks, a loose kick allowed the home full back to collect and chip the ball over our defence. In keeping with the way the game was going, the ball sat up perfectly for him to collect and cross the whitewash to a 54-5 Half Time score.



A superb start to the second half saw Ali Lang bundle over for Boro's second try. But back came Ilkley with three unanswered tries on the back of a succession of penalties, taking the score to 73-10.

With a 63 point cushion, Ilkley eased off and it was all Boro from this point on. Tries from Myles Colvin, Rob Carney and two from Matthew Marsy ensured a losing bonus point for the boys in maroon and instilled some pride and something to cheer about for the travelling support. The pick of the bunch was a Carney try from an amazing cross field kick from Charlie Bourne. Rob's diving catch plucked the ball of the air for a great touch down, brilliantly converted from out wide by Aedan Moloney. Charlie also produced a delightful chip through for Marsay to collect and race in.



109 points shared. Our lads showed some heart (and some great rugby) in the second half.

KENDAL 50 V MIDDLESBROUGH 0 **SATURDAY, JANUARY 31, 2026. MINT BRIDGE, KENDAL.**

An error strewn performance saw our mighty Boro succumb to Kendal in the Cumbria countryside.



Middlesbrough won a lot of territory and spent considerable time in the Kendal redzone, but could not add the final touches when it mattered. Kendal, on the other hand, played some sensible rugby, mastered the conditions, and exercised wiley game management—often refusing to play rugby in their own half—kicking over a flat Boro line and forcing our backs to turn and chase back. Matthew Marsay spent the majority of the game fielding high balls (which he did with aplomb). He was also the victim of a couple of high tackles (as was Aedan Moloney).

Following a borderline late hit, Jack Jeffers got winded and was replaced by the returning Connor Foley.

Ruthless Kendal took their chances, one early on from a tap penalty five metres out and the second, against the run of play, when their flanker popped an unmarked oncoming teammate to race through under the posts. Middlesbrough turned down several kickable penalties and Kendal took theirs, extending their lead to 17-0 with a penalty kick. And scoring again to take a 24-0 lead at half time.

Middlesbrough put some very impressive attacks together, spending a lot of time in the Kendal 22, but they just couldn't get that killer punch.

The second half followed a similar pattern. Moose was clattered in midair. It looked like a fair collision and both players came out the worse for wear. As play carried on Kendal recycled superbly, spun the ball out through several pairs of hands and scored in the corner.

The game got a bit scrappy and niggly for a while. Boro continued to fight and battle but the Kendal defence held strong and deserved some kudos. They forced Boro errors and the continual energy sapping pressure from Middlesbrough went unrewarded.

Kendal continued to score on the break and racked up 50 unanswered points. It was a tough day at the office for the Boro, but it is recognised by the travelling support that they are merely inches away from having it all click and fall into place.

Boro hosted Harrogate in a Yorkshire league fixture. With Harrogate struggling for numbers Boro loaned them two and we played 14 aside. With the extra space on the pitch both sides tried to move the ball around to great effect. Harrogate scored first and it was a wakeup call for the lads. Boro responded with two quick tries through good handling for Charlie Polson and Jackson Palmer to score.

Oscar Griffiths then scored a great try for Boro, catching a cross field kick from James Dolan to go over in the corner. To give Boro a 17 v 7 half time lead.

Poor discipline from both teams in the second half reduced the numbers even more with Yellow cards being given, resulting in even more space on the pitch to attack.

Harrogate never gave up, scoring two tries of their own but the Boro lads attacked the space well and scored at regular intervals with tries going to Saul Bainbridge, Ewan Cooke, James Dolan and Austen Torrison. The pick of them being Saul Bainbridge who scored from 50 metres out, out pacing all the defenders to touch down under the posts, capping a fine man of the match performance.

MIDDLESBROUGH 22 V CLECKHEATON 14 (YORKSHIRE BOWL CUP) SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 8, 2026. ACKLAM PARK.

Boro hosted Cleckheaton in the Quarter final of the Yorkshire Bowl cup after seeing off a strong Scarborough side in the previous round. Previous meetings with Cleckheaton have always been close affairs and this was to be the same. In heavy conditions wide expansive play was going to be difficult and the team who won the collisions was going to have the upper hand. It was an even first 10 - 15 minutes with big tackles going in from both sides. Cleckheaton broke the deadlock with some good handling and support play to score a converted try near the posts. Boro exerted pressure on the opposition defence and kept them trapped in their own half. This pressure eventually told with Charlie Polson scoring, getting on the end of a kick over the top by Jackson Palmer. Boro kept up the pressure and Mason Lowery, who pace and power was a real threat all game, went over in the top right corner. Late in the first half, Boro could have added to their score but despite winning a series of penalties five metres out, they failed to get over the line. Half time Boro 10 v Cleckheaton 7.

Now playing down the slope, Boro again took control of possession and pinned Cleckheaton in their own half. With the forwards working hard and playing together as one, more space was opening up for the backs, with George Armstrong a constant threat with ball in hand. This produced two well worked tries for Saul Bainbridge and Mason Lowery through great handling and support play. With five minutes remaining Cleckheaton pulled a try back following repeated attacks from five metres out. But the Boro lads controlled the last few minutes to win the match and put themselves through to the semi-final. Man of the match going to Jackson Palmer.

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Help us secure the future of the club by with the Tollesby Investment bond.

At the 2021 AGM our members passed a motion to buy Tollesby playing fields. This was completed in late 2023. This was only possible by taking out a **loan** with the RFU. As it is a loan, it comes with interest, and – we have to pay it back! To help reduce the short-term financial burden on the club, we are looking to our membership for further help.

The club is issuing 50 bonds at £1,000 each, with a payback period of between 10 and 15 years. This will allow the club to smooth our cashflow allowing our current generation of players the opportunity to flourish.

Longtime supporters AV Dawson and the Port of Middlesbrough are working with us to sponsor and ensure utility of the Tollesby site. These fields are used primarily for our Juniors and Minis, so you can fully understand the importance of this asset and what it means for the future of the Club and community.

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Myth Buster

Scenario 1:

A hooker had a brain malfunction and double tapped his throwing arm action at the line out. Rightly so, a free kick was given. The opposition asked for a scrum. It was politely pointed out to the referees assessor that this was not allowed.

OPTIONS AT A PENALTY OR FREE KICK

- 20.4 A team awarded a penalty may instead choose a scrum.
- 20.4 (a) A team awarded a penalty at a lineout may instead choose a lineout or a scrum.
- 20.4 (b) A team awarded a free-kick at a lineout may instead choose a lineout.

Scenario 2:

The hooker wanted to throw a quick line out but he was stopped by the referee, stating the lineout

was formed. Two opposition players were stood on the mark of the line out. However.....

18.5: A quick throw is disallowed and a lineout is awarded to the same team if a line out has already been formed. But, per 18.11, a minimum of two players *from each team* are required to form a lineout.

Was the referee correct to stop the quick throw? Had the opposition correctly readied themselves for a lineout at the correct mark? And if play is to continue, how do they stop a quick line out without being penalised?

In the interests of equity, should the play go to a formed lineout as the opposition is ready for a line out where the ball went out?

Conundrum...

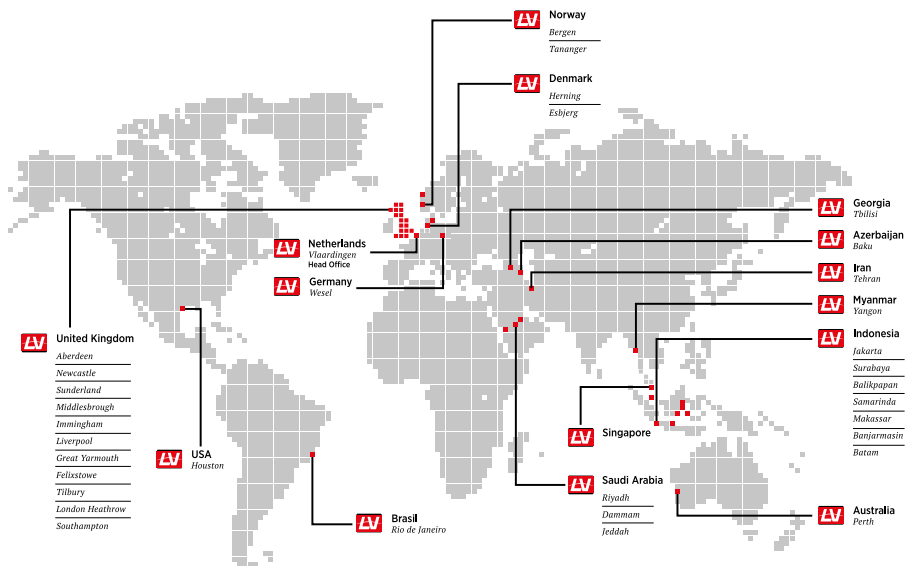

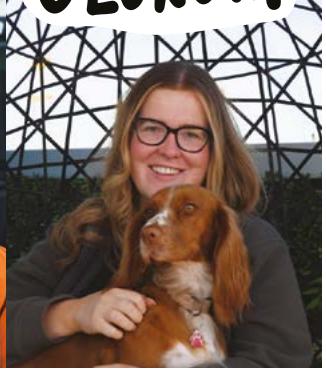

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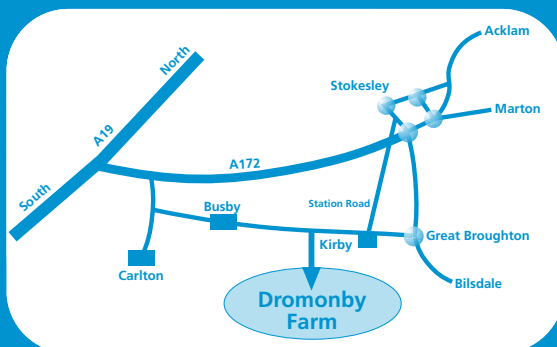
