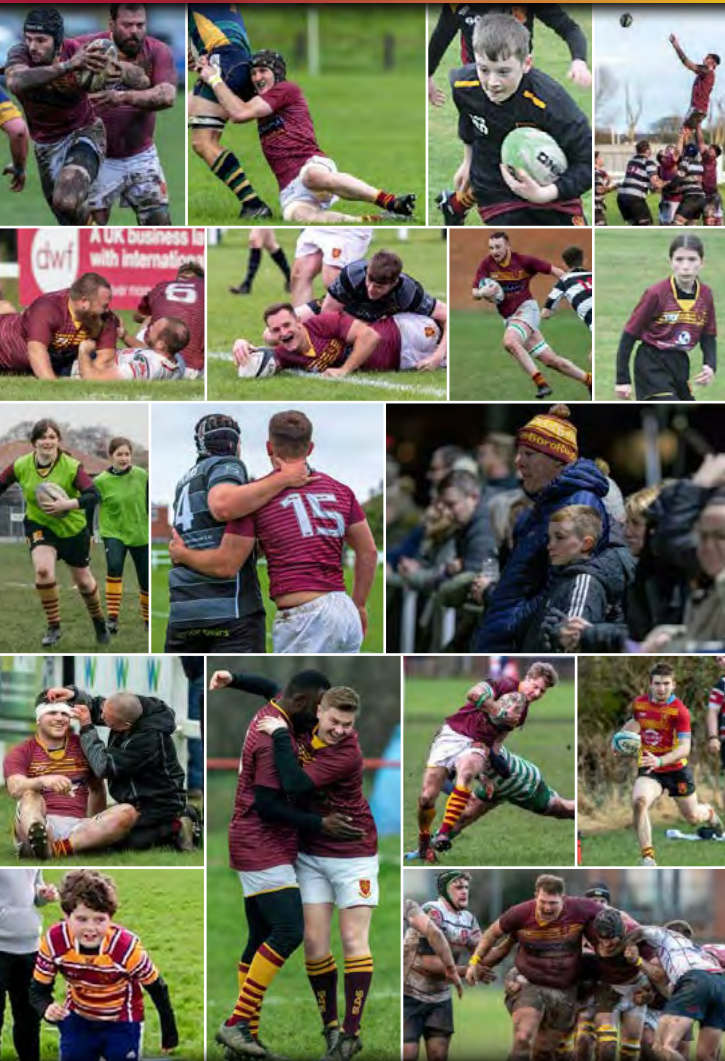

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TODAY'S OPPONENTS: BLAYDON RFC



From Crow Trees, Swalwell, on the edge of Whickham, down the A19 (or maybe the A1M all journey – doubtful), we welcome Blaydon RFC to Acklam Park.



Officially dating back to 1888, Blaydon are no new kids on the block. They started at Path Head and moved to the famous Blaydon Racecourse. For some time, they swapped between the Racecourse and The Spike. In 1951, Blaydon moved to Crow Trees.



On our last trip to Crow Trees the Boro were narrowly pipped in a second half torrential downpour during a fiercely contested and very close game. We lost 31-29 in a game which we remain convinced we would have won had the clock ticked for a few more minutes. We scored a try from Ollie Hodgson, two from Aedan Moloney and one from Myles Colvin. Aedan landed a couple of decent kicks too.



That win helped Blaydon maintain an impressive fifth place in the table with nine wins, nine losses and one draw. Blaydon should be feeling fairly confident too, following their last outing where they beat Sandal 59-21 at home.



Prior to that, we enjoyed a nice 40-29 home pre-season win vs Blaydon on August 31, 2024.

If you go all the way back to January 25, 1969, our records show a home friendly that we won 8-5 with a try from Keith Felce and a couple of kicks from Alan Old.

We hope Blaydon and their traveling supporters enjoy the Middlesbrough hospitality and hope they will understand that we have a fight of our own and a job to do.

MIDDLESBROUGH 17 V ALNWICK 56

Saturday, February 28, 2026. 2pm at Acklam Park

Middlesbrough started very encouragingly with great charges and swift recycling. A superb break from Charlie Bourne was ended by a double high tackle. Aedan Moloney kicked for the corner. The driving maul from the line out culminated with Myles crashing over for a 5-0 Boro lead.

Alnwick fired right back. A chip 'n' chase was collected and some crazy hands along the backs, coupled with some missed tackles, saw Alnwick drive over the line for a converted try: 5-7.

The game started to swing in the visitors favour. From a line out they recycled and sent the ball out wide with a powerful, flat, miss pass to their winger. He evaded the covering defence to score out wide: 5-14.

After a great opening 10 minutes from Middlesbrough it became one way traffic in Alnwick's favour. They scored two converted tries in quick succession to earn their try bonus point on the half-hour, shortly followed by their fifth converted try: 5-35.

The final few minutes of the opening half saw Boro rally and take the game to the visitors. Following a series of picks and drives with clean recycling, Josh Lynas powered over and Aedan Moloney converted for a halftime score of 12-35.

Boro started the second stanza on top. Great thumping runs from Colvin and Ali Lang took play into the opposition half. Alnwick tried to move back down the field but a loose pass was intercepted by Aedan who raced in from 50 metres for a deserved try taking the score to 17-35.

Sadly, that was the last of Boro's points. They stuck to the task and battled all the way, desperately trying to get the try bonus point. Some great defence from Alnwick, some loose kicking and some decisions that went against us prevented that. The introduction of returning scrum half Sam Gaudie was encouraging and bodes well moving forward.

Alnwick, whose position in the table demonstrated their abilities, exerted some dominance and ran in another three converted tries to take their final score to 17-56.

Saturday, March 7, 2026. 3pm at Winters Park, Penrith.

Boro burst out of the blocks in this nail-biting relegation battle.

Early pressure set up a line out on the Penrith 22. Good hands moved the ball wide for Rob Carney to score in the corner: 0-5.

The Cumbrians responded immediately. Despite some incredible tackles from Sam Gaudie, Penrith kept possession and eventually rumbled over for a short-range try: 5-5.

Straight from the kick off Boro piled on the pressure. With good hands and straight running Boro got the ball to Myles Colvin to drive over: 5-10.

More wonderful hands from Boro got the ball wide again into the hands of Matthew Marsay. He straightened his line and cut inside to score: 5-15.

Penrith came back with a couple of tap and go's from penalties to score under the posts: 12-15.

A cheeky line out from Boro had hooker Joe Sawdon surge down the left. The ball was recycled, moved right and Marsay scored again with Aedan Moloney adding the extras: Half time 12-22.

Boro attacked from the kick off. Marsay made an electric break down the wing, stepped inside and fed support runner Gaudie who popped to Harry Bryce (celebrating his 100th cap) to score: 12-27. Moloney then added an extra three following a triple series of tap and go's from successive penalties: 12-30.

From this point on, unfortunately, the wheels came off. Penrith, aided by a partisan crowd and a number of favourable decisions, fought back to score two more tries taking the score to 26-30. In the last couple of minutes it was heroic defence from Boro holding Penrith out. With the clock in crimson red, the pressure eventually told and the home team scored out wide. The touch line conversion rubbing salt in the wound: FT 33-30.

The LIONS PARK Investment

This is an investment in the future of our club and the sport we love.

At the 2021 AGM our members passed a motion to buy Tollesby playing fields, Now named **LIONS PARK**, Middlesbrough Mini & Junior Rugby Academy, in association with Port of Middlesbrough an AV Dawson Group Company.

The purchase was completed in late 2023. We need our members help to ease the interest burden from the RFU loan that was used for this purchase. The club has issuing 50 bonds at £1,000 each, with a payback period of up to 15 years.

We have already had several generous Club members make their investment and we are encouraging more to get involved.

All Bond Holders will be commemorated on the Lions Park Bond Board at the Tollesby Facility. From next season, we will acknowledge each bond holder (should they wish) in the matchday programme for our home games and each will be provided with an Investor lapel pin to recognise their contribution.

Boro Colts hosted Wetherby in a rearranged league fixture, providing Wetherby with a chance to avenge their home loss earlier in the season.

Wetherby showed their game plan straight away—running the ball at every opportunity. This approach, coupled with the requirement of uncontested scrums, favoured the Wetherby team. Boro's strengths were more physical, with a strong set piece and forceful ball carriers.

The deadlock was broken by Wetherby with some good handling creating an overlap for their first try. A second soon followed after a couple of missed tackles sent their marauding centre through under the posts.

Boro responded with a training ground penalty move resulting in a great try for Ben Leigh and a further try for Captain Will Tait, who charged over from close range.

Half time came with the scores Boro 10 v Wetherby 19.

The half time chat was to further amp up the physicality. Wetherby looked uncomfortable with our ball carriers. The aim was to exploit the gaps our picks and drives would create. Another directive was to slow down the opposition ball. Due to the uncontested scrums, it often appeared that Wetherby had ten backs on the pitch. Boro needed to suck those loose forwards into the ruck.

With Boro playing down the slope, the second half proved to be a much more even encounter. Both teams scored two tries each. Austen Torrison, showing good support play and strength, scored one. The other was from centre Rich Kensey who hit a good line, attacking inside shoulders, to score. Jackson Palmer added two conversions.

The final score: Boro 24 v Wetherby 33.

That means the league title is now out of reach for the Boro lads. But they still have a Semi Final in the Yorkshire Bowl, hosting Cleckheaton on Sunday, March 22. The Finals Day at Doncaster on April 19 awaits the winners.

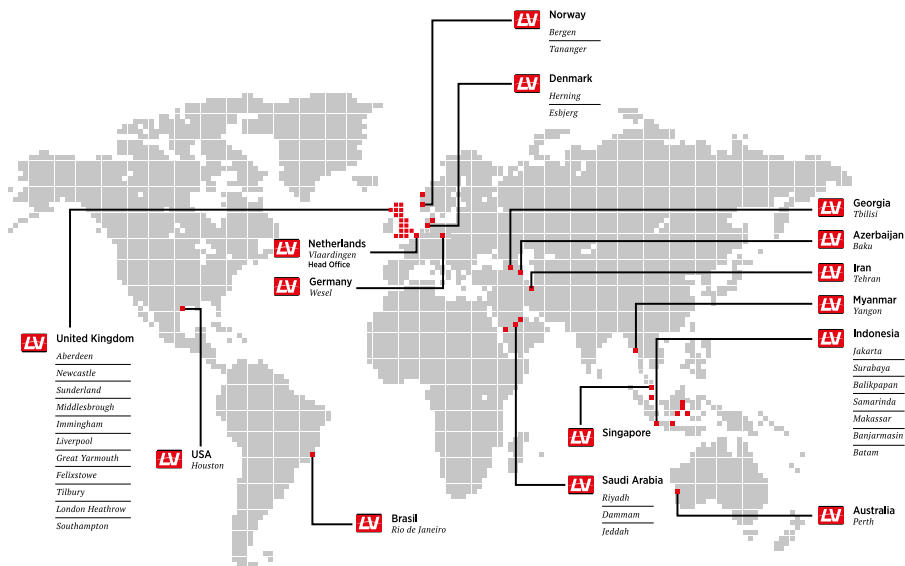

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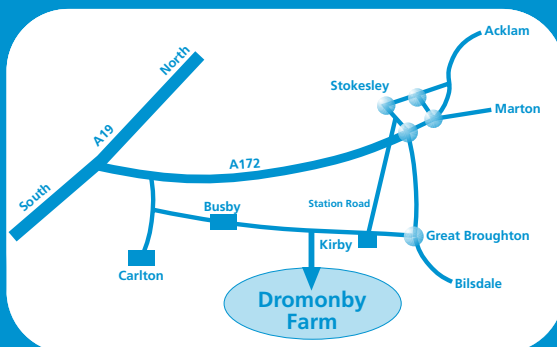
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
