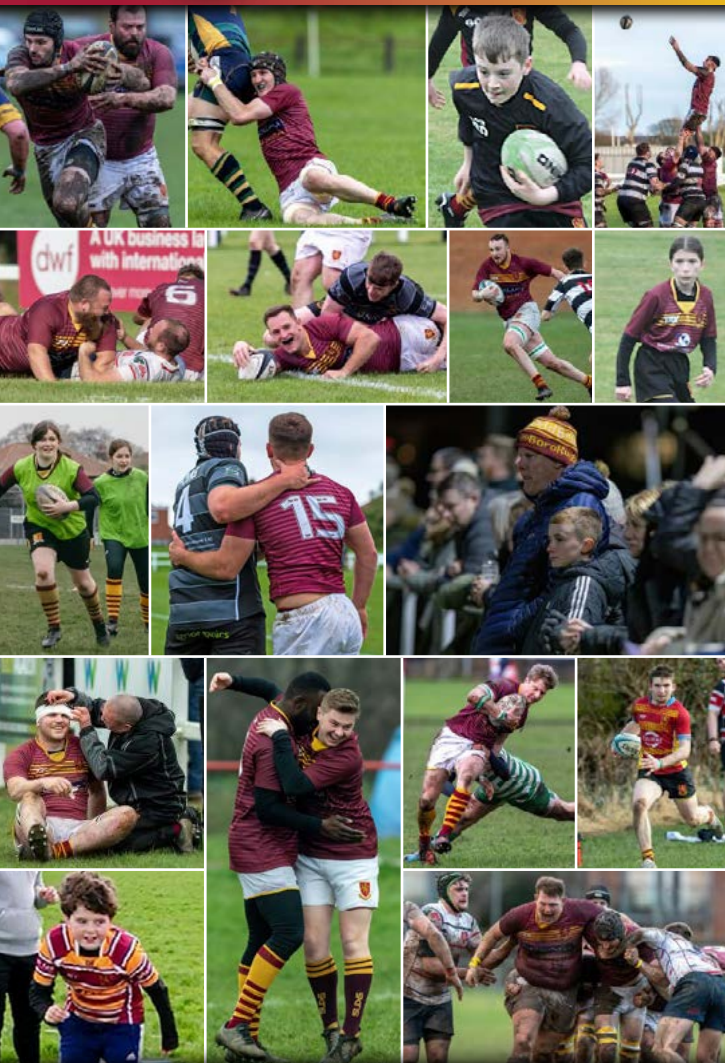

What is equally admirable, is the weekly level of support you as supporters have provided for lads all season. Whether it has been one game or all twenty-two, I know first hand the dedication you have shown does not go unnoticed and both players and coaches are extremely grateful. They are striving to repay that faith in the form of survival and hopefully today will be another step in that direction.

A recurring theme that has featured across the season in training and games is the importance of momentum. Right now, dare I say, we have it. Hopefully it can be harnessed, built upon today and if necessary, beyond.

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TODAY'S OPPONENTS: HARROGATE RUFC



For this last league 'official' game of the regular season we welcome Harrogate up from the Apollo Capital Stadium.

Harrogate have had a very impressive season with 16 wins. They sit third in the table with a guaranteed promotion play off spot – we wish them the very best for their trip up to Alnwick.

Like us, the Harrogate club dates back to the 1870's. Our earliest recorded match was a friendly back in 1948 which Harrogate won comfortably 27-0. The overall record since then was even with 22 wins each and one draw. Harrogate just managed to tilt the scale with their 35-26 win at this season's opener on September 6. On that trip down to Rudding Lane, the gallant boys in maroon acquitted themselves very well whilst being introduced to just how competitive this league is. Two tries from Brendan Hil and one a-piece from Te'Kori Moore and Jack McPhillips saw us push today's opponents right to the final whistle.

Mr Tim Wear kindly forwarded me a programme dating back to September 30, 1967. Unfortunately we lost the game 14-6 but some of those names might spark some nostalgia. It is interesting to note that, at this point, Alan Old was not yet a county player, let alone an international!

It is very much all to play for the Boro today as we try to build on the impressive wins vs Blaydon and Cleckheaton. There is still a mathematical chance we can avoid the playoffs altogether, but that would take a hard-fought win today and other results to go in our favour. For Harrogate, with third place tied up, all that's in it for them is pride and momentum. Following their 61-14 dismantling of Sandal we suspect there is quite a lot of pride and momentum with the Club right now and we expect a fierce battle at Acklam Park today.

We hope the journey up was uneventful and that all the visiting Harrogate players and supporters enjoy their day in Middlesbrough.

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MIDDLESBROUGH U15s YORKSHIRE BOWL CHAMPIONS

MIDDLESBROUGH 21 V HEATH 5

Sunday, March 22, 2026 at Heath RUFC.

The Boro U15 squad travelled to Heath for the Yorkshire Bowl Final and produced a superb performance to secure a 21–5 victory in front of a large and vocal crowd in perfect West Yorkshire conditions.

Both sides started strongly, with defences on top in the early exchanges and neither team willing to give an inch. It was Boro who struck first, breaking the deadlock through a moment of brilliance from Seth Naughton, who collected the ball and surged through the Heath defensive line with a powerful run. Austin Elliot added the conversion to give Boro an early advantage, which they carried into half-time.

Boro came out for the second half with real intent and began to assert their dominance. The forward pack laid the platform superbly, with both the scrum and lineout providing a strong foundation throughout the game.

The pressure on Heath soon told, with Harry Thompson scoring a trademark try, picking from the base of the scrum and powering over under the posts. Elliot again added the extras. Boro continued to build momentum, and Haelma crossed the line following a strong, direct run, with Elliot maintaining his perfect record from the tee.

Heath managed a late consolation score, but it was too little, too late, as Boro saw out the game comfortably to claim a well-deserved 21–5 win.

A complete team performance capped a fantastic season, with special recognition going to Seth Naughton, who was deservedly named Man of the Match for his outstanding contribution.





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MIDDLESBROUGH 48 V BLAYDON 0

MARCH 21, 2026. 3PM AT ACKLAM PARK

Middlesbrough put on a dominant display against Blaydon at Acklam Park on March 21st, to climb out of the automatic relegation spots in the Regional 1 North East League.

The Boro Boys kept a clean sheet against fifth placed Blaydon, and also secured a much-needed four-try bonus point.

Josh Lynas opened the scoring, with Boro quickly establishing themselves in the Blaydon half, despite going up the slope. A driving maul from a line-out saw Lynas powering the ball over the line, and Brendan Hill converted: 7-0. On the 20-minute mark, full back Matthew Marsay sprinted in from 20 metres out, after the ball journeyed through the backs demonstrating fine handling skills, making the score 12-0. The scoring continued with winger, Hill first scoring an unconverted try out wide (17-0), before creating another opportunity, cutting a superb line across half-way, drawing the last defender and spinning the ball out to Marsay, who ran in to score his second try of the game. This time, Hill nailed the conversion, taking the half time score to 24-0.

Boro's dominance continued as the second half got underway, with the forwards driving the ball to the try-line. Scrum half, Sam Gaudie, sniped over to score under the posts, and Hill's successful conversion took the score to 31-0. The score quickly increased to 38-0, after a tap penalty and some solid ball-recycling saw Lynas pop over the line for his second try of the game. Hill also added a second try to his tally, with another bursting run (43-0), and the scoring was complete after a splendid move from number 8, Ollie Hodgson, who secured the ball after a kick-through, immediately popping it up to Ali Lang, who crossed the line for the try. Hill's conversion attempt bounced tantalisingly off the posts, leaving the final score at 48-0.



All in all, the team put on a exhibition of positive attacking play, which lifted them from the relegation spot of 11th in the League, to 10th.

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CLECKHEATON 10 V MIDDLESBROUGH 53

MARCH 28, 2026. 3PM AT THE PAVILION, MOOREND, CLECKHEATON

A stellar away performance by Middlesbrough against a struggling Cleckheaton, saw the team rise up another place in the League tables avoiding automatic relegation from Regional One North East.

Bottom-of-the-table Cleckheaton were already relegated, and determined to put in a solid performance in the penultimate fixture of the season. Only two places higher in the league (tenth), Boro had everything to play for in a game which could have a huge impact on the relegation battle.

Middlesbrough was the first to strike ten minutes in. Fly half, Rob Carney collected a Cleckheaton kick deep in the Boro half, and set off on a decent run. He set the ball free along the back line, putting Captain Jack McPhillips through a gap. McPhillips fed the ball to winger, Brendan Hill, who sprinted in to score. Hill missed the conversion in difficult windy conditions: 0-5.



A good lineout steal from the Boro forwards put the ball into the hands of winger, Aedan Moloney, who broke through the line, drew the last defender and passed to full back, Matthew Marsay, for a great try. Hill's excellent kick, overcame the windy conditions to successfully convert for a score of 0-12. With Cleckheaton down a man due to a yellow card for a high tackle, Middlesbrough winger, Harry Bryce was the next to score after a series of excellent ball handling skills from the backs, dashing in on the 30-minute mark to make the score 0-17.

A successful penalty kick got the home team on the score board (3-17), and then Marsay showed off his sprinting shoes with a super break, getting the ball out to scrum half Sam Gaudie, who dodged a couple of tackles before scoring: 3-22.

Boro spent the remainder of the first half defending their own line, and gave up several penalties. Two Boro players ended up in the sin bin, and the referee awarded a penalty try to Cleckheaton on the stroke of half time (10-22).

Boro started the second half brightly, despite being two men down, with the forwards providing an excellent platform. Two converted tries followed, with Jack McPhillips going over (10-29), and then an excellent lineout drive produced a score from the forwards (10-36). Hill converted both. Hooker, Joe Sawdon was the next to score after some great inter-passing by Boro, with Hill again converting (10-43). Middlesbrough capitalised after another yellow card was issued to a Cleckheaton player after he halted a superb Boro break with an illegal tackle. The forwards' tap and go recycled the ball with Sam Gaudie nipping blind. Gaudie fed Hill, who shrugged off defenders to score (10-48). The scoring was finished off with flanker, Rohan Brown going over out wide for a full-time score of 10-53.

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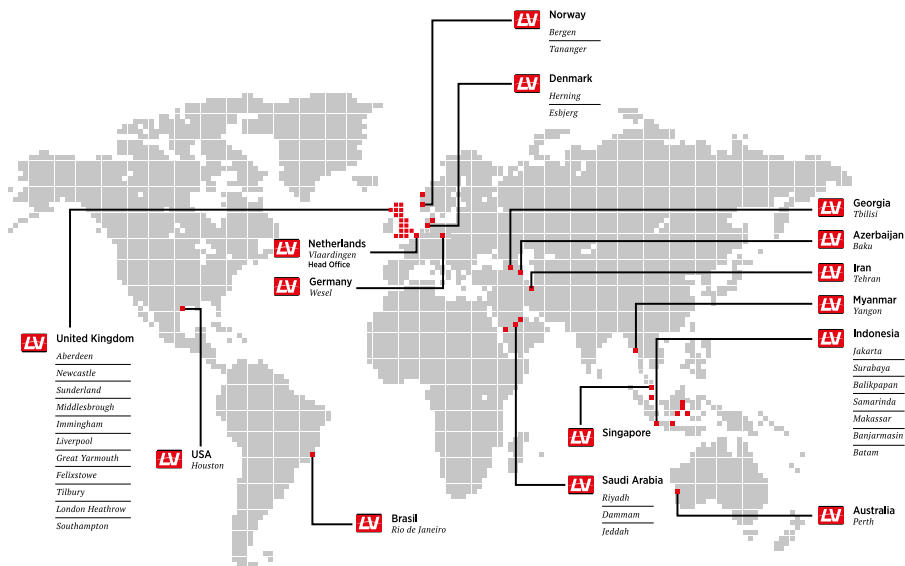

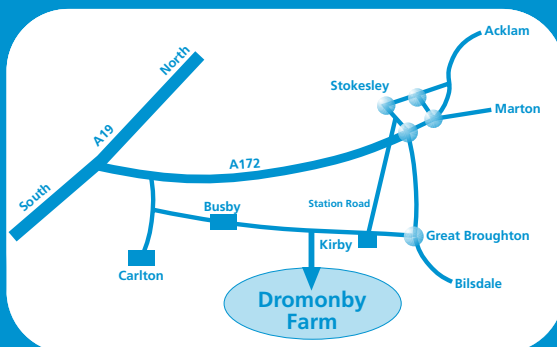
