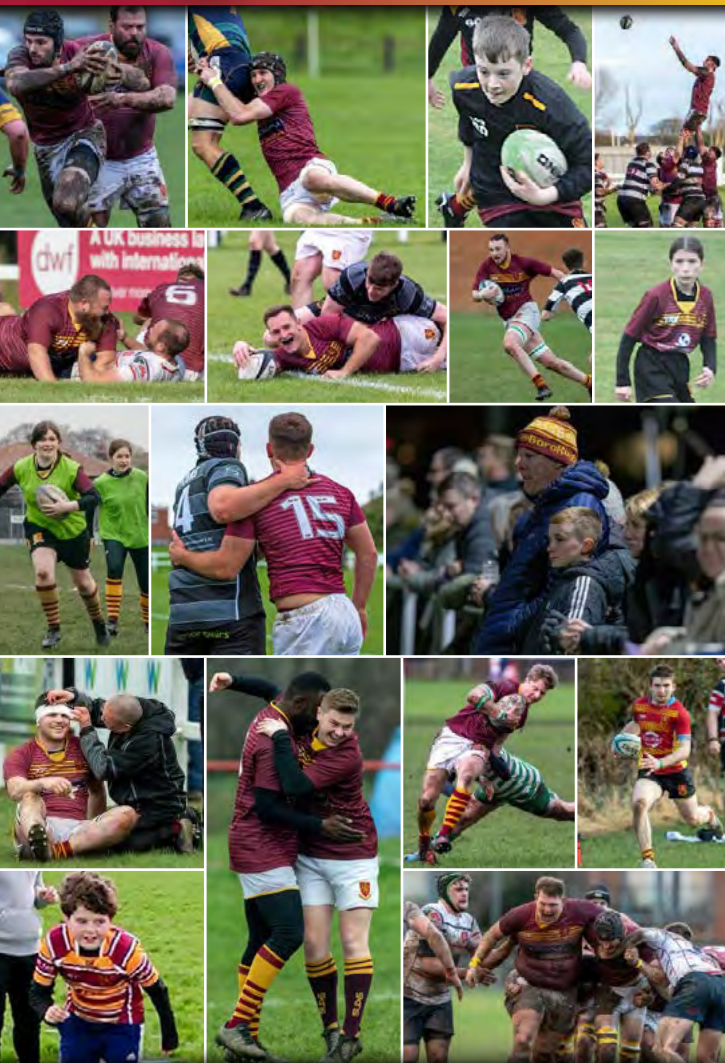

Today we welcome York back to Acklam Park for this Regional 1 NE playoff.

It has been a rollercoaster of a season for the boys from Clifton Park. York lost 11 of their first 12 league games (a home win vs Blaydon punctuating the losses). Their season turned on December 20 with a victory against Kendal. From that point, York won five out of their next six and began to climb out of the dreaded drop zone. Wins against Driffield and Ilkley bring them into the playoffs.

Middlesbrough came away with a much needed 7-39 away win in October early on in the season. York returned the favour in January, coming up to the Boro and leaving with a comfortable 17-33 victory. With the season's head-to-head tied, victory in today's game provides bragging rights and the retention of a spot in this league.

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MIDDLESBROUGH 31 HARROGATE 26

11TH APRIL 2026, 3PM, ACKLAM PARK

Middlesbrough ended the regular season with a determined performance and withstood a late fight back by the visitors to earn a solid home win against third-place Harrogate.

Middlesbrough pushed forward from the outset, spending the first five minutes camped in the Harrogate 22. Only tenacious Harrogate defence, and some impressive bravery from the visitors—spinning the ball wide 5-yards from their own tryline—kept Boro out.

Boro broke the deadlock with a great burst from Marcus Lang. Excellent support running and a couple of quick pop-passes moved the ball to Captain, Jack McPhillips, who held off his defender to score an unconverted try: 5-0.

Harrogate was next to score, after Boro lost the ball in their own 22. The visitors popped the ball out through a number of backs, and their centre broke through a few tackles to race over for a try: 5-5.



The final score of the first half came after prop, Josh Lynas burst through a gap; Lynas sucked in a man, and popped the ball to lock, Ali Lang, who picked a beautiful line to drive over for Middlesbrough's second try. Despite the blustery conditions, Brendan Hill forced the ball between the posts for a successful conversion, helping Boro to head into the break with a 12-5 lead. Boro continued to surge forward as the second half got underway, pushing the Harrogate line onto the back foot. McPhillips opened up a gap, the ball shuttling through the backs. Marsay slipped the ball to Hill on a switch, who put on a display of speed and tackle-avoidance to score. Hill added to the tally by converting from the touch line: 19-5.

A couple of penalties to Harrogate led to a tap and go right front of the posts, with the promotion contenders eventually finding the gap and easing through for a converted try (19-12).

It looked like Boro would answer back immediately, with a blistering attack bringing Middlesbrough within five yards of the Harrogate line. Incredible inter-passing between centre, Charlie Bourne, flanker, Henry Nyinguro and Hill was brought to a halt after the referee determined there was a forward pass.

Boro again found themselves on the wrong end of a series of penalty decisions, putting them under a great deal of pressure on their own line. Harrogate looked like they were in, spinning a wide ball to their speedy winger, Amrit Sharma, but he spilled it. The pressure continued, and the relief was palpable when Middlesbrough finally won a penalty for Harrogate coming in from the side. Flyhalf, Rob Carney kicked the ball to halfway.

It was Boro who would score next; Nyinguro won a lovely high lineout ball, popping it to scrum half, Sam Gaudie, and a beautiful backs move ended with Hill cutting inside and searing past the defence to score the all-important bonus point try. That try took Hill to a total of 115 first team tries for Middlesbrough, making him the second highest try scorer in the club's 154 year history. As Hill approached the conversion, the wind toppled the ball off the tee, but he picked it up and deftly sent it between the posts with a delightful drop goal to move the score to 26-12.

Shortly after, Harrogate saw a player binned and Boro capitalised with a try from McPhillips, who ran onto a superb chip from Carney, scooping up the ball and racing over the tryline (31-12).

Some scrappy play, knock-ons, another series of penalties, and an extra ten yards given away for chit-chat saw Boro under pressure again in the closing stages, and lead to two comeback tries for Harrogate. Both were converted, despite the continued windy conditions (31-26).

Harrogate continued to push right till the end, but Boro were defiant in the final moments, keeping the visitors at bay and eventually stealing the ball so Carney could kick it off the park for full time, much to the home spectators' delight.



A note from the President

I would wish to extend a warm welcome to York, our opposition today. This is the third time we have met this season. With honours even it is difficult to predict the outcome. Both sides won their last fixture against teams in the top half of the league. York pulled off a comeback to win at home 48 to 43 against Ilkley. We played some great rugby to win at home against Harrogate.

This is the first time playoffs have been introduced into the league. The season has been extended by the RFU to add more games. I am sure most Rugby supporters in the North of England would prefer that we have more teams in the league and play more games in September etc, so that the club's can manage their income, cash flow and support our clubs with a planned approach.

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COLTS VASE FINAL

BORO COLTS V DONCASTER COLTS

On Sunday 19th April Boro Colts all travelled down together to a sunny Doncaster rugby Club with fantastic facilities to play out the final of the Vase competition with hosts Doncaster Colts. For the older lads in the team this was to be their last match in age grade rugby before moving up into Seniors rugby.

Both teams warmed up on their 4G pitch before moving to the main pitch for the match. You could see the Doncaster team was older and physically bigger than Boro's, but that wasn't going to faze the Boro lads.

The match started at a frantic pace with both teams trying to dominant the other at the break down and get early advantage. A turnover won by Logan Lacey gave Boro good field position, where after several phases in the Red zone a pass found Kayleb Silk in half a yard of space who managed to crash over near the posts for a try which was well converted by Jackson Palmer. Throughout the match the Boro's back row of Oscar Pattinson, Kayleb Silk and Logan Lacey were a constant threat to Doncaster on both sides of the ball.

Doncaster then had a period of pressure but sound defence, particularly at the back with George Armstrong at 15, pulling off fine tackles to keep Doncaster out. Eventually a missed tackle by Boro gave the Donny backs room to attack and a try was scored out wide, conversion missed.

Again further pressure by Boro saw them camped in Doncaster's 22, with great carries and dominant collisions by Ben Leigh and Captain Will Tait who led the team brilliantly throughout the match.

The pressure finally told on Doncaster as they conceded a couple of penalties in their 22, one of which Boro elected to kick for goal and Jackson Palmer added the three points.

With half time approaching the game was being played out in the middle area of the pitch with both teams finding it hard to break down the oppositions defence, either with probing kicks or putting the ball through the hands. But Doncaster found some space to attack and good continuity and support resulted in a try and conversion , giving Doncaster a slender 12 v 10 lead at the interval.

Boro had a squad of 21 players for the final and changes were made regularly for every player to get good game time and be part of the final, not one player let their team mates down or the coaches Rob and Garry down.

The second half came and unfortunately it was a tale of missed opportunities for the Boro lads. Two overlaps were missed by Boro, one of which was a training ground move , executed perfectly until the last pass. Then a period of pressure by the Boro forwards on Donny's line, was halted as the ref stated the ball wasn't released. The Boro team continued to give their all to the cause, the half backs Jackson Palmer and Ewan Cooke working well together and the exciting pairing of James Dolan and Rich kensey working well together in the centre trying to find space for the outside players Saul Bainbridge, Oscar Burns, Mason Lowery, Oscar Griffiths and Dan Musicka.

In the forwards against a bigger pack , although always under pressure Boro still managed to control their own ball with Henry Vaux, William Tait, Evan Burkin, Jamie Cree, Ben Leigh , Archie Laird, Archie Matthews and Aidan Salter , all interchanging in the front row and second row throughout the match.

A lineout error 5m's from Boro's line resulted in a try and conversion for Doncaster. putting them 9 points clear. Boro battled hard to get back in the match , but couldn't break down a strong Doncaster defence. Doncaster added two further tries, the best coming from their number 8, who managed to fend off a couple of Boro would be tacklers and score under the posts.



Final score Doncaster 33 v Middlesbrough 10

Defeat for the Boro lads was treated with great sportsmanship , acknowledging the Doncaster players as they collected their winning medals and trophy. The final game for the older players wasn't the result they wanted, but they certainly enjoyed the day and the music never stopped on the way home.

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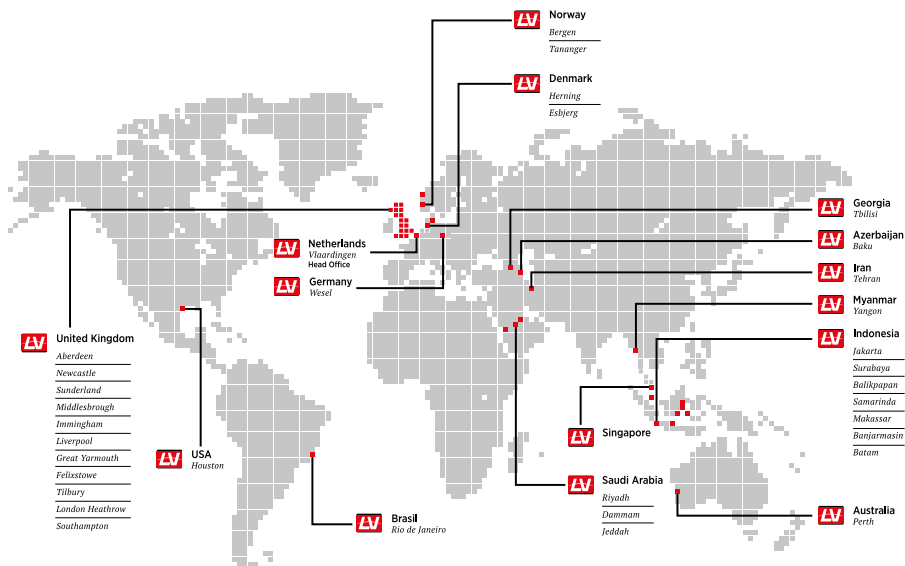

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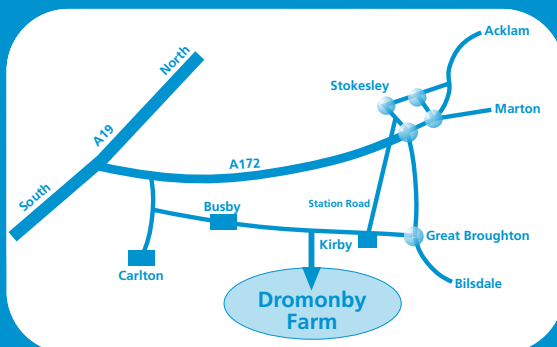
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
